WHAT DOES THE LOANSMITH DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?

Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

What?

The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service your have with us. This information can include:

- Information that you provided to us in your loan application, including:
 - Name, address, email address, and other contact information
 - Social security number
 - Banking information
 - Information about your employment
- Information we obtain about you from other parties such as:
 - Information obtained from one or more credit reporting agencies that we use in the course of underwriting your application
- Information about your transactions, such as:
 - Your payments and loan performance

How?

All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons The Loansmith chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.
